Television, radio station, and newspaper websites also may have updated school closing listings. Announcements will specify "Heritage Christian K-12" and/or "Heritage Christian Preschool." Heritage Christian Preschool, if closed, will be listed separately by name. If K-12 is closed, the preschool and Super Room **may** remain open for childcare for those students up through 5<sup>th</sup> grade who have Super Room paperwork completed. Also, HCS is NOT listed as part of Canton City Schools. If the public schools are closed, and Heritage is open, the public schools WILL NOT bus students into school and parents will have to arrange transportation.

## *From the Nurse's Office*

Childhood vision disorders are prevalent. Early identification, diagnosis and correction of children's vision disorders are essential parts of all child health programs. The purpose of vision screening is to aid in detecting school-age children who have or are at-risk for developing vision disorders. All children in preschool, kindergarten, first, third, fifth, seventh and ninth grades are screened. Observe your children for red, swollen eyelids, drooping eyelids, crusty eyelashes, red and watery eyes, squinting, frequent rubbing of eyes, a constant head tilt, complaints of pain, blurred or double vision, frequent headaches, or persistent complaints of difficulty. If you note these signs consistently, contact the school nurse, teacher, or family doctor. Early detection of vision disorders are referred to an optometrist or an ophthalmologist for an examination and diagnosis. Schools and parents working together can protect and improve the health of Ohio's children.


