The Reading Room Program is not a curriculum-based program. The program encourages independent extracurricular reading. Children will be encouraged to read and even earn rewards for achieving various levels of improvement in their specific reading grade levels. We will be purchasing tons of new books, cozy furniture, and various prizes for students to earn. The room will be located on the second floor beside the library. COMPUTER CERTIFICATIONS



Heritage’s Adult Education Program in Information Technology launched the first week of March. Our first group of adult students is currently progressing through a 12-week program preparing them to successfully pass the CompTIA A+ Certification exams in basic computing technology. Classes meet Tuesday and Thursday evenings in the new Secondary Computer Lab, room 314. The

content of this adult class is identical to what Heritage offers our high school students taking Advanced Computer classes. Heritage plans to offer the A+ adult ed course again later this year, in addition to a few non-technical computer classes. Meanwhile, as the school year winds down, five students from the high school Advanced Computer I class have expressed a desire to take the first of the two CompTIA A+ exams this spring. Mr. Brooks has made arrangement for the test through Stark State and will begin preparing these students for testing.

BLACK HISTORY MONTH ACTIVITIES

Throughout Heritage Christian School, teachers and students honored Black History Month with various activities and projects. In first grade, students focused on Martin Luther King Jr., watching a portion of his famous "I Have a Dream" speech, as well as a movie of the week that showcased his life and the principles for which he stood. They also viewed a reading of the picture book, *White Socks*, which is a story about one person standing up against injustice to turn a town from segregation to integration.

Students in the third grade learned about African-American heroes. They read "Follow the Drinking Gourd" and focused in on Peg-Leg Joe, the amazing hero that led many African-Americans to freedom by instructing the slaves to follow the Big Dipper. He also helped each slave find "a safe house" along the way. The students were deeply challenged to be able to empathize with these slaves, especially the children who had to hide in the woods or were chased by dogs. They also learned about Ruby Bridges, who was the only black girl attending an all-white school in the 1960's. She went to school even though adults protested to keep it an all-white school. She sat all alone in an empty classroom with a teacher named Miss Hurley, but each day as she walked to school, she prayed for God to forgive the "mob" because they didn't know what they were doing.

At the high school level, several English classes spent two weeks on an African-American poetry unit. Students read and listened to poems and lyrics from a wide variety of artists, beginning with poets of the Harlem Renaissance. Poetry from throughout the decades was studied, including works by Langston Hughes, Alice Walker, Gwendolyn Brooks, Sterling Brown, Nikki Giovanni, Tupac Shakur, Will Smith, and Maya Angelou. Students enjoyed watching video clips of poetry readings, spoken word competitions, rap, and poetry slams. They also looked at how poetry and art can contribute to social causes. At the conclusion of the unit, students chose one artist to research for their final projects. The projects included creating a poster, delivering a presentation, and reciting one of their chosen artist's pieces.

CHURCH LEADERS BREAKFAST COVERAGE

Heritage's annual Church Leaders Breakfast was held on Thursday, February 14th. This event provides the Heritage community a chance to honor the ministers and church leaders for all they do, especially their work with the Heritage students. This year, almost 25 visiting local ministers and church leaders were our honored guests. The guests were treated to a delicious pancake breakfast served by the cafeteria staff. They also had the opportunity to visit an elementary chapel and view the progress being made on our Ben Carson Reading Room.

INDUSTRIAL ARTS OFFERINGS

Plans are being made to offer introductory industrial arts at HCS! At the middle school level, it will be offered as a nine-week rotation class. Students will receive an introduction to the world of work, safety and good work habits, and basic tool instructions. They will complete small projects in carpentry, electrical, plumbing and construction. At the high school level, it will be offered as an elective. They will receive more advanced tool instruction and will complete larger projects in carpentry, electrical, plumbing, electricity and construction drafting. The curriculum will be reinforced by off-site visits to various manufacturing, engineering, printing, and HVAC companies.

ChooseMyPlate.gov is designed to remind Americans to eat healthfully and to make better food choices. MyPlate illustrates the five food groups using a familiar mealtime visual; a place setting. STUDENTS VISIT EDGAR ALLEN POE IMPERSONATOR WITH AMBER KASLER AND TRACY NEDELKA

In January, the 11th and 8th graders traveled to the Warehouse on the Canal in downtown Canal Fulton to attend an Edgar Allan Poe Theatre performance by John Kiste. Kiste is considered one of the finest Edgar Allan Poe experts in the country, and he captures the audience's imagination in his one-man performance. The students got a great sense of who Poe was as a person, and the atmosphere of the venue added to the mood and tone of Poe's words. Students were able to hear selections that had been covered in their English classes, including recitations of "The Tell-Tale Heart" and "The Raven." They were impressed with Kiste's knowledge of Poe, along with his memory since some of the poems are 20 minutes long. Students received refreshments and a tour of the building, as well as a book of Edgar Allan Poe's works to take home.




STUDENT ACHIEVEMENTS


SPRING PLAY



SANDY HOOK NEWS COVERAGE

HCS students and staff are praying for the families of Sandy Hook Elementary.



All of America is sad. This letter may or may not help, but I want you to know that my whole school is in tears and is praying for your family. I write this with a heavy heart, thinking about what it must feel like to have such a thing happen. I don't know what it feels like, I have had a few friends die, but losing someone in your life like a son is so much harder to get through. I'm so sorry! Jack looked like a really good kid. Again I am praying for you and hope that your family might be comforted."
