A WORD FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR



Greetings and Blessings to each of you,

It is hard to believe that the first nine weeks of school is over, report cards have been sent home, and parent-teacher conferences are completed! This fall was full of Bible Bowl, volleyball games and basketball practices, testing for academic achievement, spelling bees, fire and safety drills, play rehearsals and much more.

These are the highlights for this year so far;

- The 2012-2013 year-end financial statement reflected a very positive end of year with total net assets of \$483,491.00 versus \$313,859.00 for the 2011-2012 year. This includes \$606,397.00 in contributions from fundraisers for capital and operating expenses.
- This year (2013-2014) began with a 27% increase in students from the previous year for a total school enrollment of 281 students from Preschool through 12th grade. This led to the hiring of four new teachers. Two in the Elementary and two in the Secondary.
- A foundation gift enabled the teachers to have their classrooms painted and decorated with murals, curtains, and rugs.
- A five year contract was signed with the Martin Center to be the home court for all basketball and volleyball games and practices.
- Fifty-seven community leaders showed interest in Christian Education as they attended one of our Heart of Heritage Tours.
- With a gift from Mr. and Mrs. Gill, Stark County's first and Ohio's second Ben Carson Reading Room was made possible. The grand opening took place on October 11, 2013.

Most important of all is that students at Heritage are growing mentally, physically, and spiritually as they move toward being the person that God is calling them to be.

BEN CARSON READING ROOM

On October 11, we had our Grand Opening of the first Ben Carson Reading Room in Stark County, and the second in the state. Canton's Mayor Healy, community leaders, doctors and nurses from surrounding hospitals and supporters of Heritage Christian were in attendance. Bob and Jackie Gill sponsored the Reading Room and were the guests of honor for the ceremony. The Gill's first heard Dr. Ben Carson's story at the 25th anniversary of Habitat for Humanity celebration. They were touched by his passion for education.

Also in attendance was Tammy Blazenyack from the Carson Scholars Fund. She worked closely with Heritage from the construction of the room to the opening ceremony. Heritage will continue working with the Carson Scholars Fund as they are now also participants of the Carson Scholarship Program starting this school year. Dr. Ben Carson was unable to attend, but he sent a video congratulating Heritage on being the first Reading Room in Stark County. He also thanked Bob and Jackie Gill for their dedication to their community and support of the program. "THINK BIG is Dr. Ben Carson's philosophy that promotes outstanding academic achievement and dedication to helping others. Children, students, and adults have found that when they THINK BIG, they are on their way to achieving their goals" (carsonscholars.org). After the program, the entire student body lined both sides of the hallway holding their favorite book. Guests walked through the hallway and were able to interact with the students as they showed the way to the second floor where the Reading Room is located. Students are excited to start working on their individual goal to read 1,000 minutes by the end of the school year.

WHY ARE FUNDRAISERS SO IMPORTANT?

Heritage Christian School is a non-profit, non-denominational State of Ohio chartered school. Our state charter means we are held to State Academic Standards and the state of Ohio supplies supplemental services to meet the needs of our students, like busing, a school nurse, and Title 1 teachers. We are NOT a charter school in the sense of being compared to area free charter schools. "Community schools, often called charter schools in other states, are public nonprofit, nonsectarian schools that operate independently of any school district but under a contract with an authorized sponsoring entity that is established by statute or approved by the State Board of Education. Community schools are public schools of choice and are state and federally funded" (According to ODE website, 2013). We are a non-public private school, which means that we do not have to abide by the "separation of church and state" laws. This is where we can exercise our freedoms to learn through Christian education.

We can receive money from the government through our participation in the Ohio EdChoice Scholarship and Income Based Scholarship programs. We are proud of our participation in School Choice. We at Heritage believe that every family should have access to Christian education if they desire it. The money received through both tuition and scholarships only makes up a fraction of what is needed to address the needs of our school.

Non-profit means we spend only what we raise. We do not receive government subsidies nor do we want to. We choose to be self-sufficient so that we can continue in educating our students through a Christian worldview. We literally apply what we raise through fundraising to pay for the heat, staff and faculty, school updates, food delivery, and other necessary items.

We look at our function as being a part of a three-fold ministry of home, church and school. In order to have the academic excellence through our bible-based philosophy, we all must take responsibility in that. As a school family, our success relies on the commitment to teamwork in the pursuit of excellence of Christian education.

Thank you to our families and those who support Christian education. When you participate in fundraisers, pay sports fees, and donate items, you are supporting the very thing that makes us different than any other public and public-chartered school! You are supporting the very reason you choose private school education and the people that make it possible year after year. What we raise, we reinvest into your child's future.



SHEDDING LIGHT ON THE NEED FOR CHANGE.



Mr. Granger, Middle School Social Studies Teacher and Middle School Boys Basketball Coach, challenged his students in his Civics class to learn how to become a good citizen. "One of our responsibilities is to make our opinions known. I decided the best way to learn how to do that was to put this to action. The students had to decide on an issue and then figure out who would be the best person to contact. Jordan was one of the first ones done and had really good results."

Jordan Harris, a 9th grade student, wrote a letter to his city councilman, Mr. David Dougherty. Mr. Dougherty is the council member for Ward 6. He graduated from the United States Army Military Academy and is the Director of Security/ Parking at Aultman Hospital. Jordan appealed to Mr. Dougherty's interest in public safety and expressed his concern about the lack of street lights in his neighborhood. He felt that the absence of street lights led to more crime.

Shortly after Jordan's letter, he had a great report to share. "Not only did he (Mr. Dougherty) add a street light, he also paved our road where the bumps were. How about that? We as young people can be responsible for the change we want to see in our neighborhoods/communities".

This is a four part project that will take place throughout the school year where students have to write a letter and address first, a local official, second, a state official, third a national official and lastly the President of the United States. The letters are written by the student, reviewed and approved by Mr. Granger, and then mailed to the intended receiver.

Mr. Granger adds, "Several have heard back from the person they wrote. One student was even invited to contact the mayor of Massillon so they could meet. I am still encouraging her to do it. They have state and federal officials they will contact through the rest of the year. So hopefully we will have some more interesting stories to share".

September and October got off to a whirlwind start in the Secondary.

Progress Book was once again rolled out during the third week of school. This is the online tool that enables parents to stay on top of their student's day to day progress. All new access and passwords were sent home. Students can also have their own account to keep track of their work. If you still need help navigating and using Progress Book, please make an appointment to stop in and see Mrs. Seese.

Teacher/Student Prayer groups were put into place this year. The students were divided amongst the staff so that each group has 7-10 students. Then we periodically spend time praying, talking and studying God's word within those groups. It gives the students a more personal and intimate time to discuss things that are on their minds and then find out what God has to say about them. Teachers are also leaving encouraging and prayerful notes and letters for the students.

The Sophomore class took the Plan Test. This test measures a student's academic success midway through high school as well as to help these students continue their preparation for college and career choices. The Junior class and a large group of Home School students took the PSAT/NMSQT test. This test is a standardized test that provides practice for the real SAT test, allows students the chance to enter national Merit Scholarship programs and gain access to college and career planning tools.

All Juniors and Seniors attended a college fair at Kent State where over 150 colleges were represented. The High School Student body also had the opportunity to attend a free seminar hosted by the Stark County Mental Health Board about teenage depression and suicide. Christians in Action (CIA) is in full swing as well as several other service opportunities. Each week our student body sends a team, led by a staff member over to the Total Living Center, about 84% of our student body participates with CIA. They do service work for this community outreach. We also had 25 students participate in the 4th annual Café Disco in Stark County. This is a prom for adults with Developmental Disabilities. Our students gave up 6 hours on a Saturday to share the Love of Christ with some very special people.

CARSON SCHOLARS FUND

Heritage is pleased and excited to announce that through a generous donation we are able to award ten Carson Scholarships for the 2013-14 school year. One eligible girl and boy in each class from the 4th through the 8th grades will receive a \$1,000 scholarship upon graduation from high school.

The Carson Scholars Fund was founded in 1994 by world-renowned pediatric neurosurgeon, Dr. Benjamin S. Carson and his wife, Candy. The Carson Fund is a non-profit organization that aims to recognize and reward students who earn and maintain a high level of academic achievement and who also exhibit strong Christ-like, humanitarian traits. Since 1994 over 5,700 scholarships have been awarded in all 50 states and the District of Columbia.

Scholarship winners are designated as "Carson Scholars" and receive a \$1,000 scholarship that is held in a special trust fund until the student graduates and is accepted to a four-year university or college. Winners are honored at an awards ceremony where they will receive an Olympic-sized medal and a certificate of accomplishment.

In December, qualifying students will be nominated and their names submitted to a panel of judges at the Carson Scholars Organization. Students will then receive an application from the panel with a special essay question to answer and submit. After the essays are returned and reviewed, student winners will be announced in the Spring of 2014.

The Carson Scholars Fund executes and manages the entire scholarship process. Students receiving this prestigious scholarship award are not eligible to receive additional scholarship funds but are recognized for their continued high achievement and are eligible to apply for continued recognition year after year until high school graduation through the Carson Scholars Organization.
