

A Teacher In-Service was held on June 17 & 18 at the Amish Door Inn in Wilmot, Ohio. Tammy Puch, a consultant at Malone University, presented on Brian Cambourne's Model of Conditions for Learning. Mrs. Puch discussed many applications of the theory to the classroom and also on how to create a diverse learning environment. The focus of this theory is to understand how students learn and teach them

accordingly. There was also deeper discussion on the function of the brain and how that affects learning in both boys and girls. The staff also participated in a session from Bob Jones University in Greenville, South Carolina about Bible Integration by Dr. Bryan Smith and Donavan Hataway.

The Board of Education was in attendance as North Canton Chief of Police Steve Wilder and Sergeant C. Saler, Commander of the Canton Regional SWAT Cooperative Team gave a presentation about the Active Shooter/Assault Training Exercise they will be conducting on August 22, 2014 for all HCS staff. This program was also used to train other area schools including North Canton City Schools. The overall goal for this training is to ensure the staff at HCS continues to provide a safe and secure learning environment for each and every student.


STUDENT ATHLETIC ACHIEVEMENT

UPDATES FROM THE BOARD OF EDUCATION



Another successful school year has passed with Heritage students being impacted in a very positive way, not only in their academic achievements, but in their spiritual lives as well. Our goals of Academic Excellence, Bible Based Curriculum and Instruction, and Commitment to our Community, continue to be top priorities as we prepare for the 2014-15 school year.

One of our major projects for the new school year is to make Heritage Christian School a much safer place for our students to learn and grow. As we consider the increasing incidence of violence and killings in schools across the nation, it is absolutely necessary to take the needed precautions to ensure that our kids are as safe as possible while they are in our care. To accomplish this we are taking the following precautions:

- 1. A stop, check, and pass system is being put in place to insure that we know at all times who is in the school building and that all visitors have a visitors pass prominently displayed while in the building. As this process is streamlined, more information regarding the proper procedures for entry/exit of the school building will be forwarded to all parents/guardians, visitors, etc.
- 2. To ensure rapid communications between faculty, staff and police; portable walkie-talkie radios will be provided to Heritage personnel on duty during school hours.
- 3. Comprehensive training will be provided to all Heritage faculty/staff personnel by Canton and North Canton Police Department, school security experts. This training will equip our personnel to have the knowledge and confidence to properly respond to various types of threat scenarios that conceivably could confront our school.

Other needed improvements to the school building are in process over the summer and scheduled to be completed in time for the beginning of the new school year in August. They include:

 Installation of a new roof over the main part of the school building.

- The boy's restroom on the third floor is being completely renovated. Once completed, this will be the fourth restroom that will have been remodeled.
- The ceilings, walls and lockers in the hallways on the third floor are being repaired and will be given a fresh coat of paint.
- All of the seats in the auditorium are being repainted.
- New classrooms are being painted and equipped with desks, smart boards, etc., to accommodate the expected increase in our student population.

The most important resource for ensuring that our students are receiving the best possible education, our teachers, have been involved in training classes to make sure they stay on the cutting edge of available teaching techniques, technology and methods to integrate sound biblical doctrine in all subjects. All of this is to make sure we are equipping our kids for the challenges they will face as they mature into young adults.

Finally, the 14 members of the Heritage Christian School Board of Education are working diligently to provide the faculty, staff, and parents the support they need to continue to provide our students with the best quality Christian education experience possible.

The Lord has been faithful and gracious with HIS blessings on Heritage Christian School this past year. The following highlights are a small portion of the accomplishments made during the 2013-2014 school year. It goes without saying that the key to this past year lies with a very dedicated and committed Board of Education, teachers

and staff, parents, and students that give their time, talents, and treasure in support of Heritage Christian School to continue our Mission of ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE, on a BIBLICAL FOUNDATION with COMMITMENT to our COMMUNITY, the nation and the world.

Highlights from this past year include:

- Enrollment increased from 197 students to 243 students K-12.
- Employed 4 new teachers for a total of 24 teachers.
- External and internal renovations to the physical facility included all classrooms painted, heating and lighting improvements, second floor boys bathroom renovated, partial roof repair in progress and new kitchen equipment installed.
- A five year lease on the Martin Center provides a home gym for basketball & volleyball and conversation has taken place with Canton City /Parks and Recreation Department on the Meyer's Park upgrade.
- A full time Marketing Director and Business Manager Position established.
- Progress made toward achieving the 9 VISION 2015-2016 ASPIRATIONAL GOALS.
- Continuing excellent programs in art and music, athletics, and most importantly a quality educational experience for every student from Pre-School through the 12th grade including daily Bible study and prayer with participation in one of two weekly chapels including local mission work.

INDUCTION OF JUNIOR AND SENIOR HIGH BETA CLUB MEMBERS

A total of 27 students were inducted into the Middle School and High School Beta Clubs. These students have to maintain a 3.30 GPA or higher for three-consecutive nine week periods and have to meet honor and character requirements.

OHIO GRADUATION TEST

Passing the Ohio Graduation Test is required for students to graduate from high school. These tests are distributed in 10th grade. Ninety percent of our sophomore class has passed this exam on the first attempt compared to the state average of 82.5%. All full-time sophomore students that have gone through the program here at Heritage have passed all of their OGT tests on their first attempt.

Congratulations to the eleven HCS students that traveled to Mt. Vernon Nazarene University to participate in the ACSI speech meet on Tuesday, March 18th. Abby Arelt and Cody Spitale assisted as timekeeper and door monitor, and nine students competed earning 3 Superior and 6 Excellent. Heritage took home two "Best in Category" trophies, so a special congratulations to 1st place winners Ruthanne Brooks and Nathan Davis!

ACSI REGIONAL ART FESTIVAL

Twenty-one students attended the ASCI Art show this spring. Students received 5 Good, 11 Excellent, and 5 Superior with 2 Best in Show. Congratulations Ethan Lamiell (3rd grade) and Carrie Rexrode (4th grade) on receiving Best in Show.

IRA G. TURPIN AWARD

Mikal Meadows was named as an "Ira G. Turpin Scholar" this May. This scholarship honors the late Honorable Ira G. A second enrollment period for Ohio EdChoice will take place in July and school enrollment is ongoing throughout the summer.

ATHLETIC HIGHLIGHTS

What an exciting year for the Athletic Department. We started the school year with a new web page that is all things HCS Athletics to improve communication between the school and the public. We also have an active Twitter account where people post scores, share pictures, and we can easily announce schedule changes or postponed games. Holding our basketball games in our own home gym this year was an incredible blessing. Students hung signs, seniors were showcased and the school took pride in having their own home. We are excited to have volleyball games played there next year and to continue strengthening our relationship with the Martin Center.

We have two student athletes that will be continuing their sports careers in college. Logan Webster will be playing basketball at Ohio Valley University and Nathan Martin will be playing boys' basketball at Malone University. We are proud of the leadership our senior athletes have exhibited in our program and they will be greatly missed.

TECHNOLOGY UPDATE

Heritage has been approved by Cisco Networking Academy to start the process of using Cisco approved curriculum and testing beginning 2015-2016 school year. Cisco Systems, Inc. is an American multi-national corporation headquartered in San Jose, California, that designs, manufactures, and sells networking equipment. Thanks to a grant awarded earlier this school year, the IT Department has finished replacing all classroom teacher computers, office computers and library PCs with new Intel Core i3 desktops. All computers in the building have now been migrated off Windows XP in time for Microsoft's end of support for the XP operating system. The entire wireless network infrastructure in the building was upgraded this fall.

PRESCHOOL PROGRESS

Preschool has had a terrific school year. We close with enrollment at 44 students. We are very pleased with the growth and retention of the preschool students. Our teaching staff has done a remarkable job this year and we are tremendously blessed to have each of them here at HCS.

We have 25 students that have graduated Pre-K this school year. We have 13 students that will be moving upstairs to attend Kindergarten here at HCS next fall. We are in the process of applying for Step up To Quality; this is a star rating system that Ohio Department of Job and Family Services and the Ohio Department of Education apply to early childhood programs to improve quality in early learning. This program encourages low ratios, smaller group size, higher staff education and improved learning standards. Mrs. Tricia Burton and I met with former HCS Preschool Director Elisa Schleig, currently an Early Childhood Specialist at the Early Childhood Resource Center, on May 7th to discuss the transition for our program. She has been a wonderful help with getting us started in the right direction! We will start as a one-star facility and climb step by step. We are looking to have this program in place shortly after the start of the upcoming school year.

The preschool has also been selected to receive an Early Childhood Education Expansion Grant in the amount of \$80,000. This will provide tuition for 20 students that are eligible; they will need to meet certain income guidelines. We will be receiving details in the coming weeks as the project period begins July 1st.

With a heavy heart I must announce that our 3 Years Teacher, Jenna Schiffhauer, resigned from the preschool. God gave her to us for a season, and we appreciate all she has contributed to our program.
